Choose one of the following two scenarios.

SCENARIO 1: Society

You spent two weeks in Pakistan with your cousin. She showed you around and told you about her lifestyle in Faisalabad. On your return, you decide to write an article for your school website in **Urdu**.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- what was your travel to Pakistan like **and** why did you go there
- where you stayed
- what was the local area was like
- activities you liked/disliked during your stay
- what you thought about your cousin's lifestyle
- whether or not you would like to visit her again in the future.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.

OR

SCENARIO 2: Culture

You recently celebrated a festival in Pakistan. On your return, you have been asked to write an account in **Urdu** for your school/college magazine.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- what your journey to Pakistan was like **and** how long you stayed
- what you thought about the local area where you stayed
- what preparations you made to celebrate the festival
- what you liked about the festival
- in what ways this experience was different to celebrations in Scotland
- whether you would recommend this type of experience.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.
