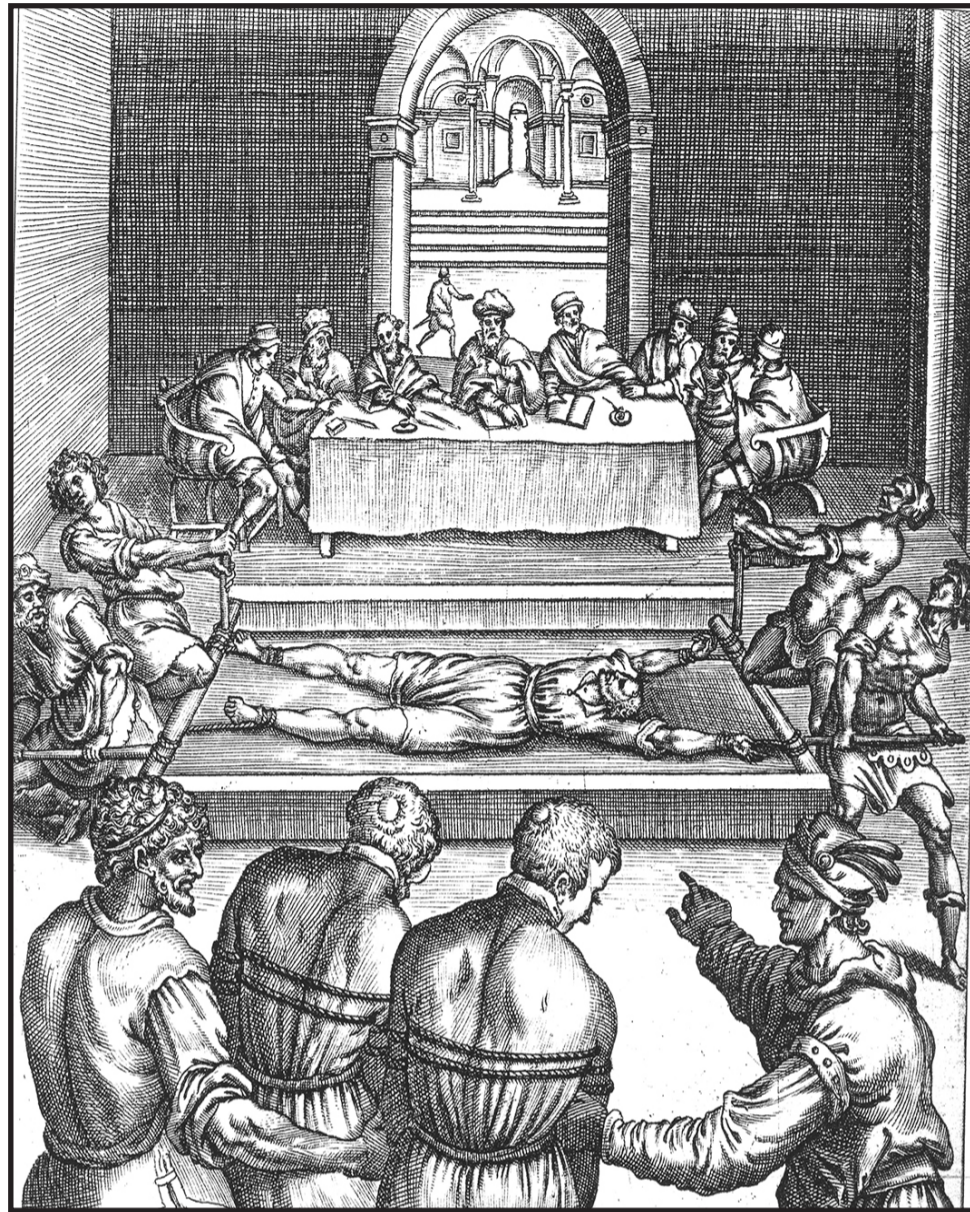

**SOURCE A**

**[An engraving showing Edmund Campion, a Catholic priest, in the Tower of London. He has been stretched, lying across a raised frame with his hands and feet tied to rollers at each end. Men are using poles to turn the rollers and tighten the ropes. Other men are sitting behind a table watching and writing down notes. Two prisoners, who are tied with ropes, have been brought along to watch what is happening to Campion.]**

**Any priest holding a Catholic service, and anyone attending, will pay a large fine and be imprisoned for a year. Anyone who tries to persuade people to disobey Elizabeth or become Catholic is guilty of treason and will be executed.**

**There are many hospitals in London which provide charity for the poor. These were given as gifts to the city by King Henry VIII and are paid for by the generosity of the citizens of London.**
