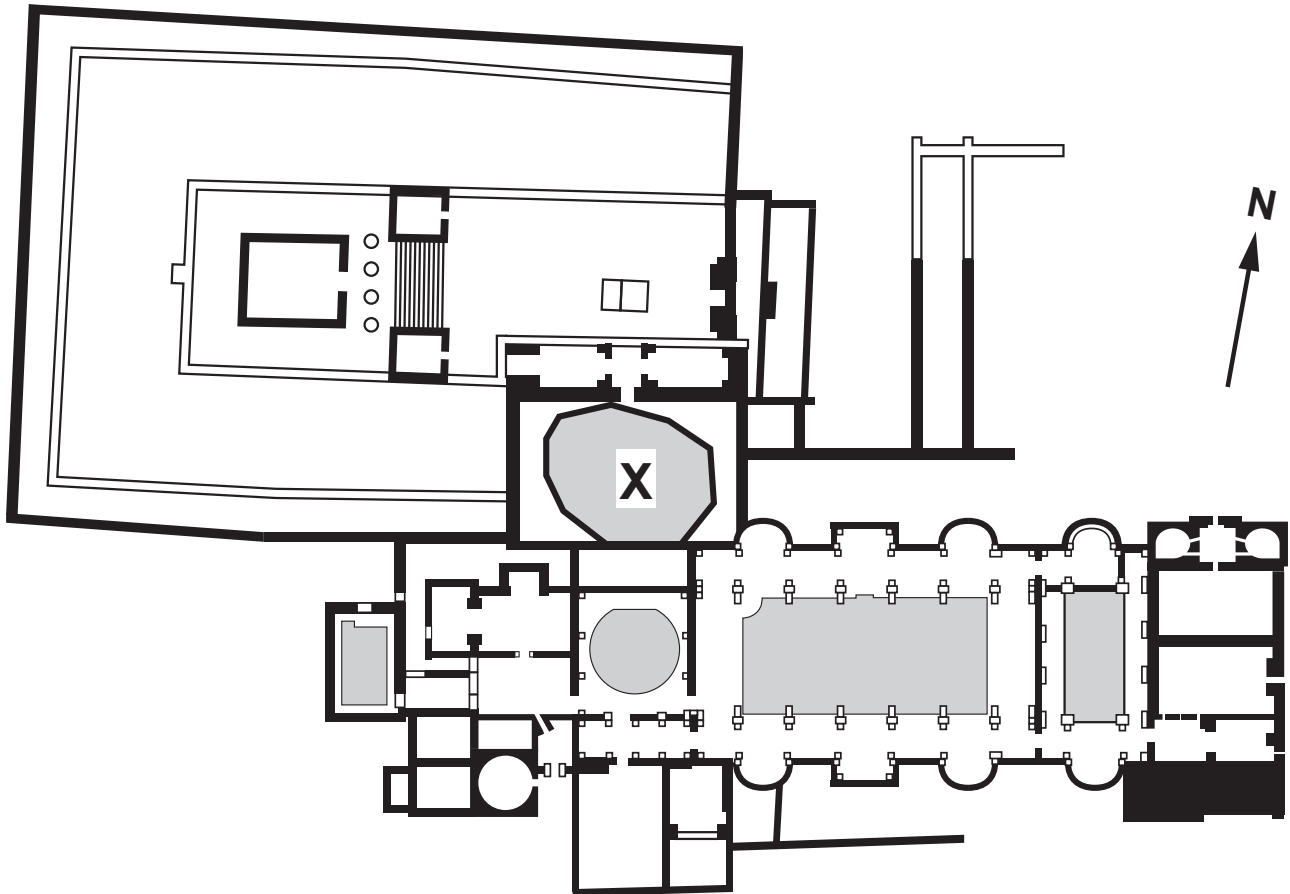

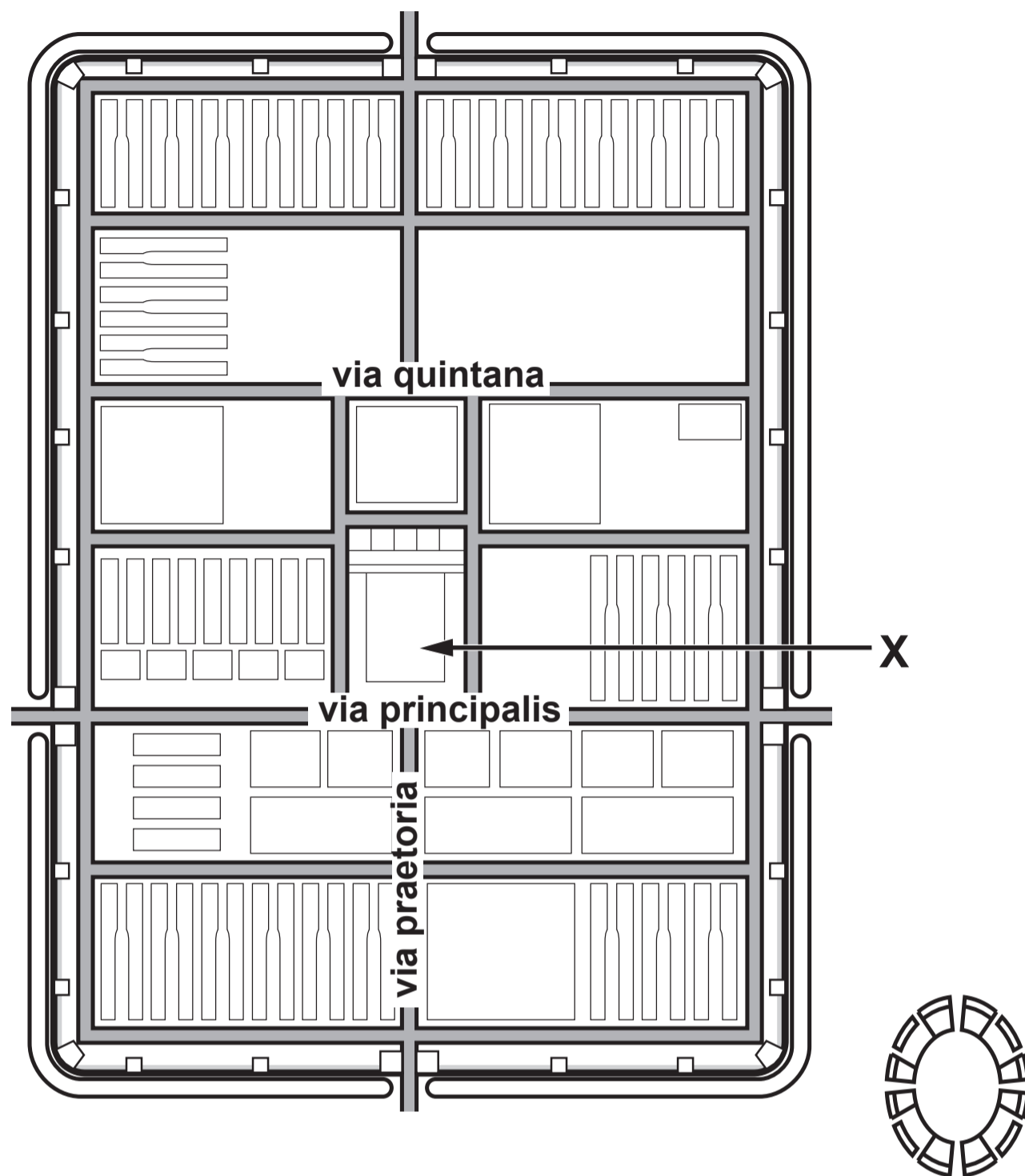

QUESTION 1



The plan of the fortress shows the following features:

1. The fortress is rectangular in shape with curved corners.
2. The headquarters building (**principia**), labelled **X**, is in the centre of the fortress.
3. There are four gates at or near the centre of each side of the fortress.
4. One road, the **via praetoria**, goes from the bottom gate to the headquarters building.
5. Another road, the **via principalis**, goes from one side gate to the opposite side gate and passes in front of the headquarters building.
6. There are several other roads crossing the fortress from side to side, equally spaced out. One of these is called the **via quintana**.
