A Vietnamese poster, on the opposite page, about the fall of Saigon, 1975.

The female figures are a Vietcong soldier, and a North Vietnamese factory worker. In the background are famous places in North and South Vietnam.

The words on the poster say, 'Vietnam's Total Victory.'
