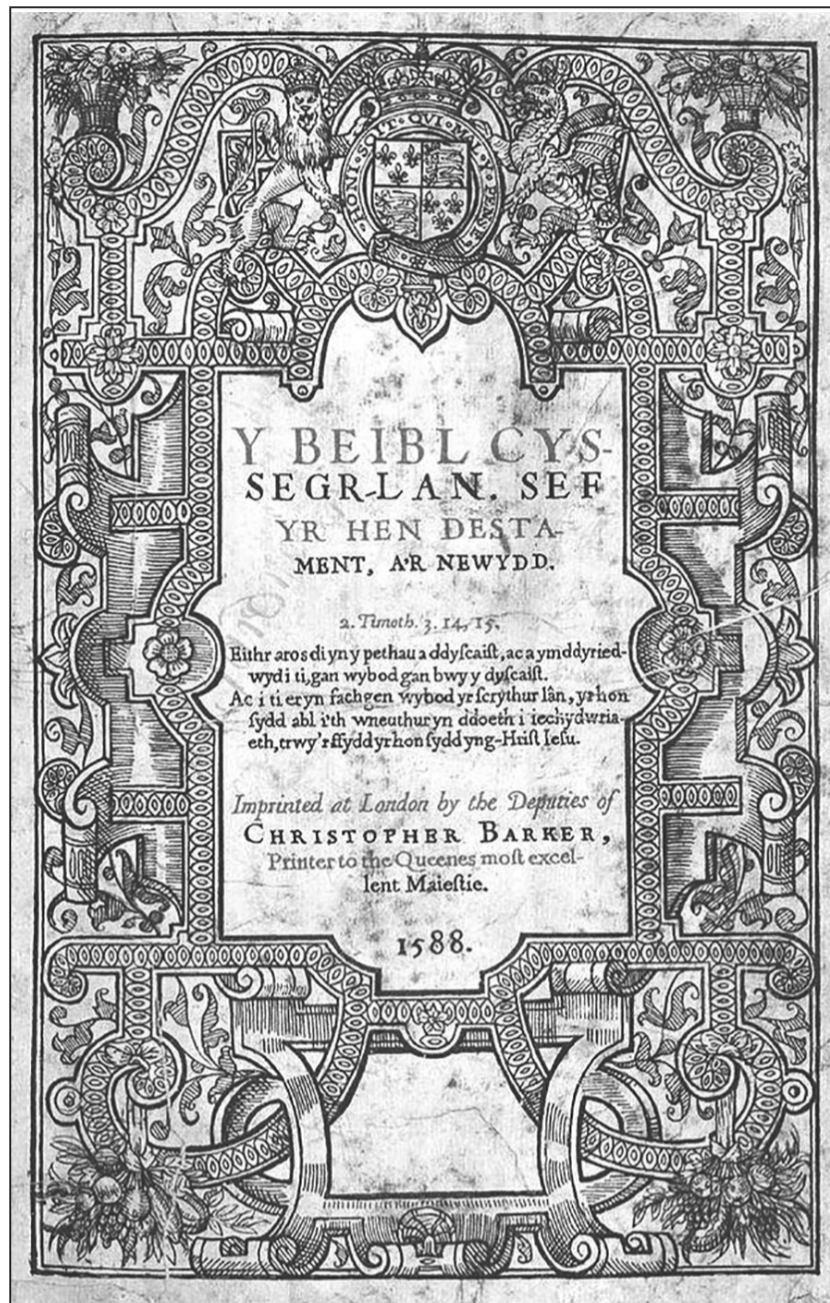
SOURCE A
