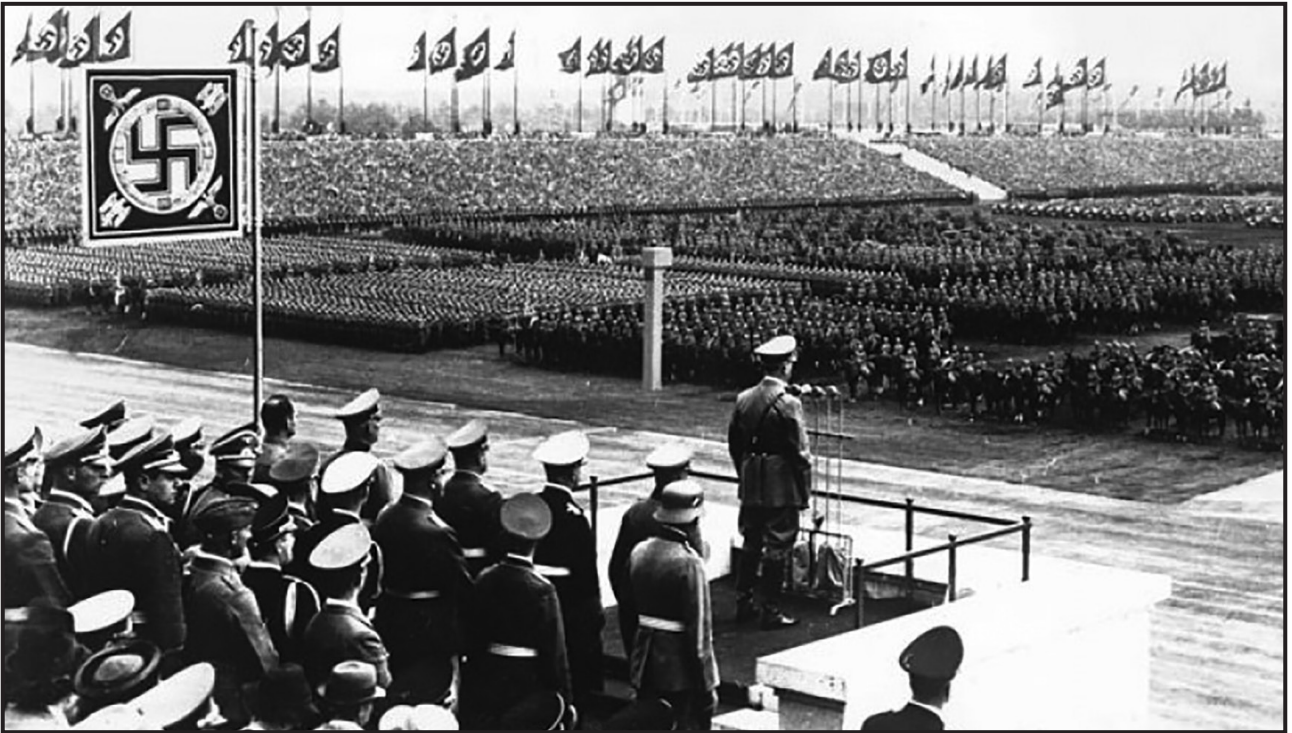

SOURCE A









To what extent was the appeal of Hitler the reason why the Nazi Party achieved power in 1933? [16 marks]
