Choose **one** of the following two scenarios.

SCENARIO 1: Learning

Last year you went on an exchange trip to a Gaelic school/college in Nova Scotia.
On your return you write about your experience, in **Gaelic**, for your local newspaper.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- when you went there **and** how you travelled
- what a typical day on the exchange was like
- what activities you did
- what you enjoyed most/least about the exchange
- what you learned from your experience
- whether you would recommend this experience to others.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.

OR

SCENARIO 2: Culture

You recently attended a large musical event.
Write a report, in **Gaelic**, about your experience for your school/college website.

You must include the following information and **you should try to add** other relevant details:

- what the event was **and** where it took place
- how you travelled there
- who went with you
- what was your opinion of the event
- what you did afterwards
- whether you would recommend this experience to others.

You should write approximately 150–180 words.
